RE: Letter to all Stakeholders

As we look back over the last five years since we first opened Serenity School at South End Croydon to a small cohort of 25 pupils, which, during a period of profound change to our world due to political, health and economic change – it is remarkable how much we have accomplished, not just from an academic perspective, but in our steadfast dedication to helping our students, families and local authorities with special educational needs and the additional barriers and complexities associated with living with SEND on a daily basis.

Some quotes from His Majesty's Inspector from May 2023 Inspection of Serenity School Coulsdon.

"Pupils love coming to Serenity School. They described their experiences very positively, saying that they are happy and feel safe".

"Pupils thrive here in so many different ways. Often, their previous experiences of school have been negative. Leaders know that time is precious. They have unrelenting aspirations for every pupil".

"Pupils' personal development is exceptional. The school's approach to personal, social, health and economic education has been well thought out. Pupils learn a plethora of important topics in their personal and social development lessons".

The dedication of our headteachers, management teams and teaching teams has been exemplary in all areas of education and childhood development to the extent that all our schools that are eligible for a full Ofsted Inspection by the DfE have been judged Outstanding in all areas of the inspection framework. It is worth noting that only 2% of all schools in the UK that are registered as Independent special schools for ASD/ADHD hold the status of Outstanding in all areas. We hold two of these positions! 100% record.

To place this in context, since August 2018, the percentage of schools judged outstanding overall has declined from 21 per cent to just 19 per cent nationally.

The decrease is largely driven by a decrease in the proportion of schools rated 'outstanding', which fell from 8 to 5 per cent. (Schools Week Reporter 2022 Edition No.4)

In an era where a large proportion of schools judged outstanding under the previous Ofsted framework have now lost their outstanding status, we at Serenity Education Group have achieved two outstanding judgements in consecutive inspections in the last 12 months. This confirms the quality of education we have on offer across the three tiers of our curriculum.

Serenity School Eltham – Grade 1 Outstanding in all areas of the inspection framework April 2022. This inspection was particularly satisfying considering that it's the first time inspected.

Serenity School Coulsdon – rated Good 2019, now judged Grade 1 outstanding in all areas May 2023

Serenity School Crawley – Pre-Inspection Dec 2022. Due our first full Ofsted Inspection in the coming weeks.

We will continue to support families across Southeast England with SEND. We are currently serving the needs of just under 300 pupils with a capacity to serve 405 pupils. By 2024 with the introduction of our Maidstone School this will rise to 555 pupils.
