

Parent Survey Analysis Report

Overview

This analysis covers 28 parent responses collected between 7th-17th July 2025. The survey assessed key areas of school performance using a 5-point scale from "Strongly Disagree" to "Strongly Agree".

Key Findings

Most Positive Areas

Child Happiness and Safety

- 96% of parents agree or strongly agree their child is happy at school
- 89% agree or strongly agree their child feels safe at school
- These are the strongest performing areas in the survey

SEND Support

- 92% of applicable parents agree or strongly agree the school provides good SEND support
- This represents excellent provision for children with additional needs

School Expectations and Achievement

- 89% agree the school has high expectations for their child
- 86% feel their child does well at the school
- Strong correlation between expectations and outcomes

Areas for Development

Subject Range

- 82% agree there's a good range of subjects available
- Some parents feel curriculum breadth could be improved

Bullying

- 96% of parents report their child has not been bullied
- Where bullying has occurred, 67% agree it was dealt with effectively
- Generally positive but room for improvement in response effectiveness

Overall Satisfaction

- 89% would recommend the school to another parent
- Strong endorsement despite areas for improvement
- Indicates overall confidence in the school
