Novel: Chains by Laurie Halse Anderson

Chains by Laurie Halse Anderson is a historical novel set during the American Revolution, following a young enslaved girl named Isabel as she fights for freedom and justice. The story explores themes of slavery, courage, identity, and resistance, showing Isabel's struggle to survive while making difficult choices about loyalty and independence. It encourages students to reflect on fairness, human rights, and the importance of standing up for what is right.
