# Caple Manor College







If your child has a passion for working with animals, we work in partnership with Caple Manor College who are specialist in animal management, zoology, veterinary science and dog grooming. Our pupils thrive on the weekly experience of working with animals. They have developed an awareness that farmers have an important role to play as custodians of the British countryside and wildlife.

## Croydon Auto Bikes (CABS)



Our pupils attend motor bike workshops twice per week to learn about motorbikes (such as basic engine maintenance, the carburetor, suspension, wheels and bearings). Our pupils are supported to learn about safety, riding skills and the consequences of illegal behaviours; the course includes a day trip to a specialist off-road motorbike track, where our pupils enjoy the fruits of labour, by riding the bikes, after they have been maintianed and repaired.

# Youth Social Action – Serenity Young Ambassadors



Pupils took part in the Team London Youth Ambassador Project over the past six weeks. Pupils worked in teams and small groups to further various social causes within their local communities. On this occasion, our pupils passionately addressed some societal injustice such as sexual and physical assault. # Going Against Violence (GAV) Workshop










# Numeracy and Literacy

When pupils join us at Serenity School, they complete a baseline assessment in Numeracy and Litercay. Based on the results pupils are allocated in Band 1, Band 2 and Band 3. Band 1 and Band 2 means that pupils perform below their expected age for Maths and English. Students who are in Band 3 will be able to access to the Literacy and Numeracy curriculum independently. Students in Band 1 receives 2 weekly 1:1 Numeracy and Literacy

sessions of 25 minutes. Students in Band 2 take part in one 1:2 weekly session of 25 minutes.

Pupils who willingly engage in the Numeracy and Literacy intervention sessions and complete their work to a high standard and make good progress receives a £10 Amazon voucher.

# Student Council










## Tower Of London visit
